At Namwianga Mission Hospital (NMH), the pharmacy shelves are filled with hope, healing, and—most importantly—essential medicines. This remarkable achievement would not be possible without the steadfast generosity of donors like you. The Zambian government supplies only a small portion of the drugs needed, but it is your generous funding that ensures the pharmacy can meet the needs of every patient who walks through its doors.

Ronald Simbaya, NMH’s dedicated pharmacist, sees the impact firsthand every day. “People come from far places to this hospital because we have the essential medicines,” Simbaya says. “They know they will be treated and get the medicines they need.”

Menson Siamukololo understands the importance of a fully equipped pharmacy. Menson, 46, was admitted to NMH with an infection and episodes of fainting. During his stay, he was diagnosed with diabetes.

Thanks to the NMH pharmacy, every medication prescribed for Menson was immediately available, both for his current treatment and for managing his newly diagnosed diabetes at home. “I appreciate what the hospital has done for me and for the medicines that were provided,” Menson says gratefully.

Simbaya knows that without these donor-funded resources, the outcome could have been very different. “You’ll find at many government hospitals that they just do not have the drugs available. **The funds we receive (from donors) really make a difference,**” he said.

"Zambia Medical Mission is a very huge gamechanger for Zambians in rural areas," he affirms. "The people in these areas live too far from town to access medicines. They just cannot manage because of the distance. We are able to provide the medicines they need in their own community."

Last July, the medical mission pharmacy dispensed 25,000 prescriptions to patients who otherwise would have gone without. Every dose, every prescription, and every healed patient is a testament to the difference that your generosity makes.

Because of your generosity, Namafuga village now has a brand new well. Clean, safe water is just a few steps away.

I want you to hear from someone whose life you changed. Annett Mpasela is a mother of four. She says:

"The new well has changed people's lives. We used to dig for water from the riverbed, and that water was very dirty. Now we are happy because we are drinking clean and safe water. It has also saved us time. We can be done drawing water from the hand pump within 3 to 5 minutes! Our children used to miss school because they had to help in drawing water. This time they attend class because they are no longer waiting for water at the river."
