### A Day at Namwianga Mission Hospital Seeing your generosity at work

On a typical Wednesday morning, a line of mothers and babies is waiting outside a clinic room. Sylvia Mung'wato has brought six-week-old Trinity for his immunizations. **"I like bringing my baby here,"** Sylvia says. **"I gave birth at this hospital, and they take good care of you."**

In a nearby ward, Lewis Maketo sits by the bedside of his elder brother who is suffering from late-stage cancer. Lewis is pleased with the care his brother receives: "There is consistency here," Lewis says. **"The treatment is always good, and they have medicines."**

Across the hospital campus, Sunana Sunana has come to receive a Personal Energy Transport (PET) cart. He was paralyzed in a mining accident last year. **"This (PET cart) will change my life,"** Sunana says.

Chief of Staff Dr. Steven Chanda appreciates his staff and the support of donors. "Our staff is very compassionate, and people know that when they come to Namwianga they will get excellent care.

**"Because of donations, we have the supplies, we have the medicines – we have what the patients want and need,"** Dr. Chanda adds. "Donor contributions built our surgery theater, the only one in the district. Lives have been saved because of C-sections that are done here."

## “Pills on Wheels” Is Ready to Roll

Your financial gifts provided medicine for the “Pills on Wheels” pharmacy bus. Zambia Medical Mission (ZMM) uses the yellow bus to store and dispense medicines during the medical mission clinics in rural areas.



Patients hand in their prescriptions at the front of the bus. A ZMM team member goes down the bus aisle selecting the prescribed medicines from plastic trunks. The filled prescriptions are handed out at the back of the bus and a nurse gives instructions to the patients. **Thanks to you, medicines are purchased and ready for medical mission clinics in July.**

## Babies Helped by Milk Program

Your generous donations funded the Milk Program for 2023. The Milk Program provides infant formula for babies whose mothers have died. Family members who are caring for the infants bring them to Namwianga monthly for a health check and to receive formula.

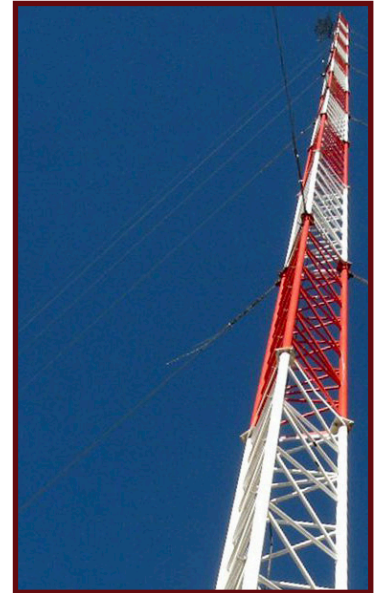
# Radio Has Tremendous Potential for Spreading the Gospel

The night sky is dark except for the stars. A fire lights the center of a small rural village. Three families are gathered around a battery-operated radio. Tonight they are listening intently to a sermon and Bible readings on Namwianga Christian Radio (NCR).

The scene is a common one in rural Zambia. Communities without electricity rely on solar- or battery-powered radios for news, informational programs, and spiritual encouragement. Namwianga Christian Radio is a lifeline for these communities.

**“We have tremendous potential for reaching out with the message of the gospel,”** said station manager Robby Banda. **“Our radio station has the strongest signal in our area, and we have the second tallest tower in the entire nation.”**

Members of the Evangelism and Spiritual Growth team preach and teach on the radio every day. Listeners call in and request personal Bible studies. Team members travel to meet with listeners and study with them. These studies often result in listeners committing their lives to the Lord.
