Milk Fund brings life and hope to babies and families

Mutinta tenderly kisses her grandson's forehead. "I used to feel hopeless," she says. "It killed me inside to see my grandson crying because he had no milk."

Mutinta's daughter passed away just days after giving birth. Her sudden death left the family shattered.

"We grieved for days," Mutinta remembers. "Every time I looked at my grandson I would break down and cry. I had no clue how I was going to raise the boy."

Mutinta's despair turned to hope when a kind doctor at Namwianga Mission Hospital told her about the Milk Fund. Mutinta went to The Haven that very day. "They were so understanding and helpful," Mutinta says.

"The Haven gave us six tins of formula. I was filled with so much joy."

Mutinta is one of the 85 caregivers who receive formula through the Milk Fund—a program at The Haven, Namwianga Mission's orphan care ministry.

In rural Zambia, infant formula is hard to find and far too costly for most families. For infants who have no mothers to feed them, the Milk Fund is a lifesaver.

Each month, a caregiver brings the infant to The Haven to collect formula. A staff member checks each baby's health and growth. The support continues until the baby is ready for solid food.

For Mutinta, the impact of the Milk Fund is deeply personal. "Believe me," she says, "if The Haven hadn't given me formula, my grandson would have died of hunger. No one in our family could afford it. Formula is just too expensive."

From Hunger to Hope: “Food relief has made a difference”

Ackson Dwili and his wife live with seven grandchildren. Ackson recently described the hunger—and the relief—his family experienced during Zambia’s devastating drought.

“Last year we didn’t harvest even a single cob of maize from our fields. Not one single cob.

“I was always stressed, thinking of ways to find food for my family. At times we would go to bed hungry and have the children waking up in the middle of the night crying for food.

“There was a point when my grandchildren stopped going to school because they couldn’t go to school on an empty stomach and couldn’t bear seeing their friends at school having something to eat at lunch time and them having nothing at all.

“But ever since we started receiving mealie meal from (Namwianga’s) food relief, we have never gone to bed hungry or spent all day hungry. My

grandchildren always have porridge in the morning before they go to school, and when they come back from school, lunch is available. Food relief has really made a significant difference in my household.”

Last year Namwianga Christian Secondary School faced daily power outages lasting up to 16 hours. The government had imposed rolling blackouts to conserve the nation's dwindling power supply.

The school's diesel generators offered a noisy, expensive lifeline—barely enough to light classrooms. Meanwhile, the kitchen battled food spoilage, wasting precious resources. Nighttime security was a constant worry.

With help from generous supporters, the school installed a reliable solar power system.
