Namwianga College of Nursing ranks #1 in Zambia

Namwianga Mission College of Nursing (NMCN) has been ranked #1 in the nation by the Zambia Nursing and Midwifery Council. Out of 114 nursing diploma colleges, NMCN achieved the highest graduation rate and led the country in the percentage of students passing the final national exams.

This recognition would be impressive under any circumstances—but it's especially remarkable given that NMCN is just getting started. The college opened its doors in 2022, and the 2025 graduating class was only the second in its history.

College administrator Nangana Miyanda shared her joy: “I couldn’t be more proud of my team and my students.”

She explained the secret behind the success: “One reason we achieved this milestone is that we take our programs very seriously. We set high standards because our graduates care for people’s lives. Students know they must perform to the best of their ability.”

Where Expectant Mothers Find Care, Community, and Hope

Safe births start at Namwianga Mother's Shelter

In rural Zambia, few women can make the long trip to a hospital or clinic when labor starts. It is just too far. That's why **expectant mothers come to the Namwianga Mother's Shelter, where they can stay safely for the final four to six weeks of pregnancy and deliver at Namwianga Mission Hospital with skilled medical attendants.**

Namwianga's hospital is also the only place in the region with an operating room, making it the only facility where women can receive C-sections. Other hospitals and clinics send their most difficult cases here, including mothers carrying twins or triplets, and women who need extra monitoring and care.

These mothers don't come alone. Each one brings a supporter—often a mother, grandmother, aunt, or cousin—and sometimes even young children. What could be a frightening time becomes a **close, caring community as the women talk, cook, laugh, and encourage one another.**

The women are also being strengthened spiritually. Throughout the week, college students,

the Evangelism and Spiritual Growth (ESG) Team, and local evangelists lead worship services and Bible classes for them. Some women have been baptized while living at the shelter, and some have invited the ESG Team to plant churches in their villages.

The Mother's Shelter includes three large houses. Together the houses provide 100 beds for mothers and their families.

A new kitchen was added this year. Before, women cooked outdoors over open fires—a difficult and unsafe setup, especially in the rainy season. Now they have a safer, more efficient kitchen with 48 compact stoves that use far less wood and charcoal, plus a roof and open sides for ventilation and weather protection.
